Notice is hereby given pursuant to Texas Government Code, Chapter 551, that the Board of Directors (the "Board") of Bridgestone Municipal Utility District (the "District") will meet in regular session, open to the public, at the **Bridgestone MUD Operations and Water Education Center, 19720 Kuykendahl**, Spring, Texas, on **Tuesday, June 18, 2024**, at **6:00 p.m.**, at which meeting the following items will be considered and may be acted upon by the Board:

A. PUBLIC COMMENT

Each person may have up to three (3) minutes to speak. Consistent with the Policy and Procedures for Public Comment (available on the District's website), persons desiring to offer public comment should complete a Public Comment Card and provide it to the presiding officer or the District's General Counsel before the meeting begins. Consistent with applicable law, the Board may only respond with specific factual information or a recitation of existing policy.
